Personally appears Redding Byrnes of Dawson County, State of Georgia, who, being duly sworn, says on oath that he is a *bona fide* citizen and resident of said County and State, and has resided in said State continuously ever since the 14th day of Nov, 1868; that he is 65 years old and by occupation a Farmer, that he enlisted in the military service of the Confederate States (or of the State of South Carolina) during the war between the States, and served for the term of 4 years in Company 10th, of 2nd Regiment of South Carolina; that his physical condition is as follows: Infirmity, poverty and age

of the value of 200 Dollars. I am now earning by my labor, none Dollars per month. That by reason of his physical condition and poverty he is unable to support himself by his own exertion or labor, and that he receives no pension but the one herein applied for.

Deponent desires to participate in the benefits of the Act approved December 15th, 1894, and the Acts amendatory thereof, and makes application for the pension to which he is entitled for the year 1900. I have heretofore, as a resident of Dawson County, been allowed a pension for the year 1905.
